Investing savings in WIF is not the only way to get involved: leaving a gift in your will can make a huge difference – a saving for the future. You can remember WIF in a number of ways in your will – a specific gift or amount – a percentage of your estate, the residue after you have provided for family.

When drawing up your Will, we encourage you to think of your family first. We also recommend that you consult with your solicitor to prepare or alter your Will.

If you have already made a will it's a simple matter to include a bequest for Wesleyan Investment Foundation, and if you don't yet have a will your solicitor can advise you how to go about it.

IF YOU ARE ABOUT TO MAKE YOUR WILL

and you would like to include a gift for the WIF, the appropriate wording for inclusion in your Will is:

"I give and bequeath free of all duties to Wesleyan Investment Foundation the sum of \$.....* for the general purposes thereof, and I declare that the receipt of the Financial Controller or other authorized officer thereof shall be a full and sufficient discharge to my Trustee(s) for such a bequest."

IF YOU ALREADY HAVE A WILL...

and you would like it altered to include a gift for the WIF then you would need to add a 'codicil' to your Will.

A 'codicil" is added to the end of your existing Will and would read:

This codicil dated.....is an addition to the Will of me (name in full). Other provisions contained in my Will are confirmed.

I give, devise and bequeath to Wesleyan Investment Foundation , the sum of \$.....*

*Instead of naming a particular amount in dollar terms, you may wish to substitute a percentage or fraction of your estate, or leave the residue of your estate (after making provision for family and other concerns) to Wesleyan Investment Foundation.
